

# Processional

**Tune:** *Processional* (traditional) **Source:** traditional **Sequence:** 6 [double steps](#), [galley](#), [foot-together-jump](#). Repeat as many times as needed to get into position.

## Detailed Description

The processional is a sequence of steps repeated while traveling from one place to another. The entire sequence is repeated as many times as needed until the dancers are in place.

### Version #1

The sequence as Banbury Cross dances it is:

Six [double steps](#), [galley](#), [foot-together-jump](#).

### Version #2

The sequence in Lionel Bacon's *A Handbook of Morris Dances* is:

Two [double steps](#), [galley](#), [foot-together-jump](#). Repeat.
