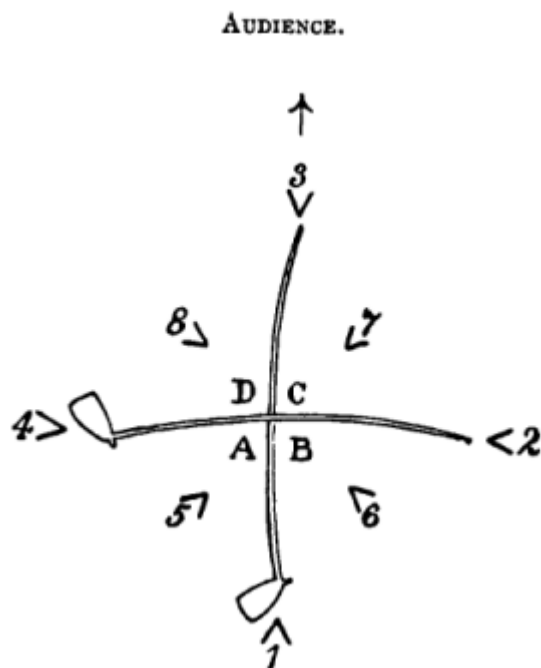


Style: Headington (Cotswold) **Tune:** *Bacca Pipes* **Dancers:** 1 or 2 **Equipment:** bagged hankies, crossed clay pipes **Stepping:** Headington single-steps, cross-backs, foot-together-jump **Source:** Cecil Sharp, *The Morris Book*, Lionel Bacon, *A Handbook of Morris Dances* **Setup:** the pipes are set up as shown below.
